

#### **Smarter Balanced Testing**

This month all 3rd—6th grade students will be taking the Smarter Balanced Standardized Test. They will be tested in 1 subject but parents are welcome to request additional testing in other subjects. If interested please connect with Miss Hannah by May 7th.

Smarter Balanced Testing is the system that was adopted by the state of Oregon to test student proficiency in Common Core State Standards. We realize that one standardized test does not tell us accurately what a particular child has learned in a year. It does indicate progress, however, and it reveals areas of relative strength and weakness. The state uses the results of the tests to measure student achievement in the state of Oregon.

It is very important for your child to get plenty of rest and arrive on time during the weeks they will be taking the standardized tests.

## **YOUNGERS**

During this past month, K-3rd grade students have dissected and examined dried beans, germinated seeds in plastic bags in our south facing windows, and planted a variety of edible greens in seed trays in our classroom. It's been fun to see and hear the excitement of children each morning as they check on the progress of our tiny seedlings which will hopefully survive and thrive when we move them to our outdoor raised beds. The goal: to eat our fresh greens before school lets out in June! Green plant studies have provided many opportunities for vocabulary development,



note taking, metric measurement, reading articles and writing observations. So, our basic skills are growing right along with our plants!
