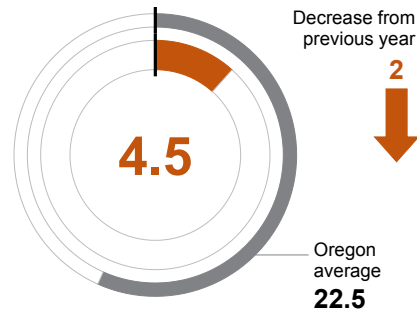

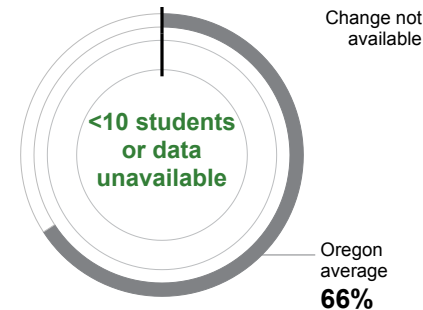
CLASS SIZE

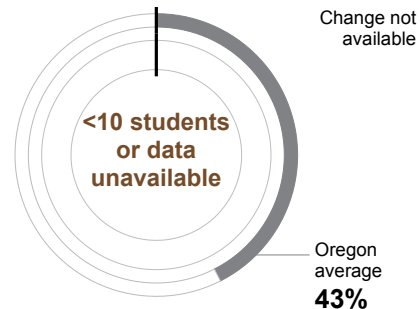

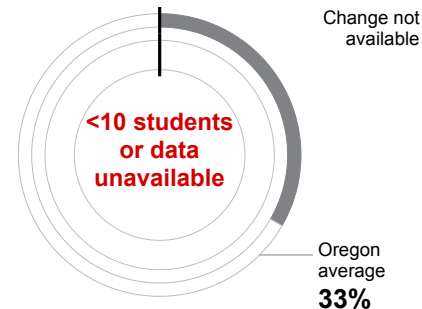

expectations.



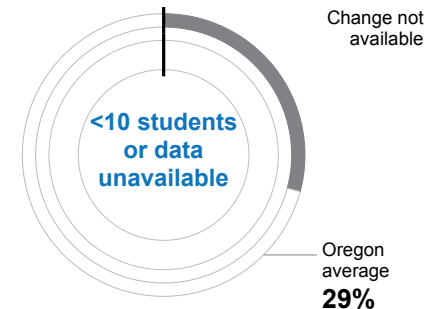
MATHEMATICS

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About Our School

BULLYING, HARASSMENT, AND SAFETY POLICIES

Pinehurst School is committed to providing a positive, safe and productive learning and working environment. EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Pinehurst School features appropriate opportunities for K-6 students in art, music, outdoor education, gardening, theater, and enrichment programs such as Family Literacy Nights and field trips. With our SIA funds, we hired an PE adjunct instructor to create a robust physical education program to meet the needs of our small, mixed-grade classes.

PARENT ENGAGEMENT

Our remote rural location depends heavily upon parental help as volunteers in the classroom; assistance with drama, art, music and gardening, various fundraising activities, and field trips.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Pinehurst School District works closely with the volunteer fire and rescue department, local businesses, Bureau of Land Management, Friends of the Cascade-Siskiyou National Monument, Oregon Extension at Lincoln and numerous local residents who volunteer and support events sponsored by the Pinehurst School Foundation. The district uses bulletin boards, the district website, community email and social media to inform the community about school happenings. The district uses surveys, personal interviews and community meetings to collect the type of information needed to create strategic plans and district goals.
